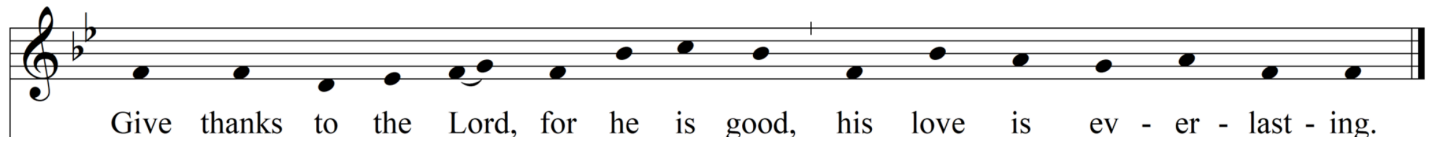


1. Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good,

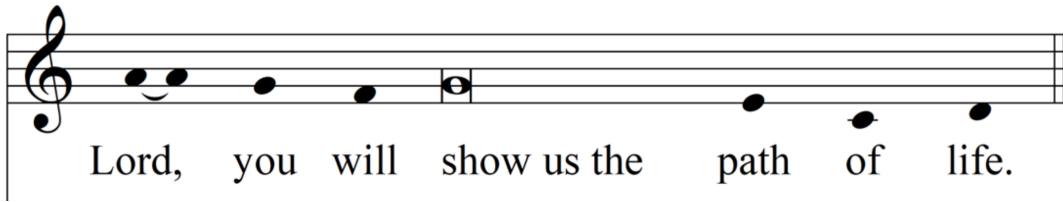


1. Let the house of Israel say,

the delights at your right hand forever. *R/*

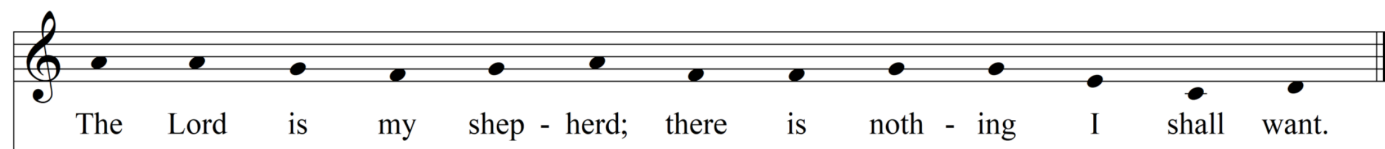

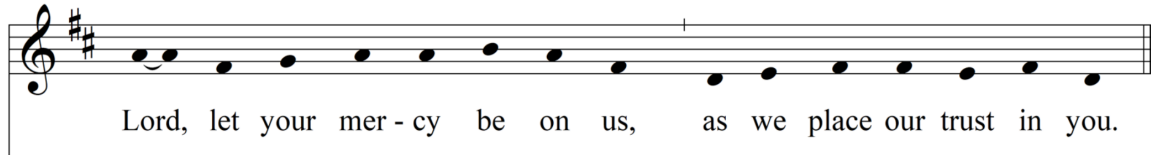


1. The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

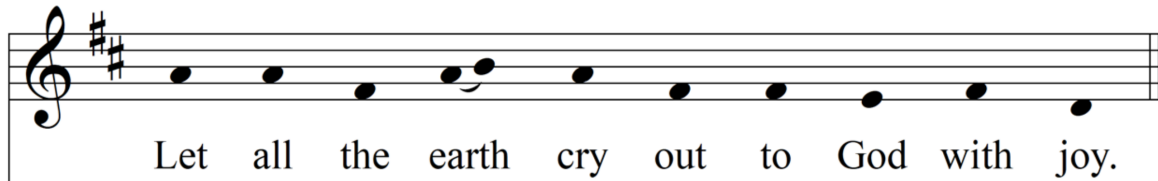


1. Exult, you just, in the LORD;

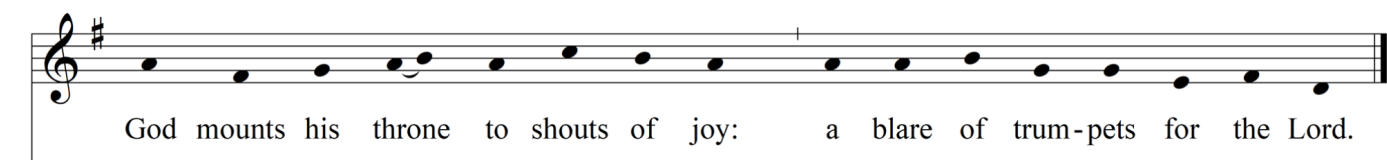
Mode 5

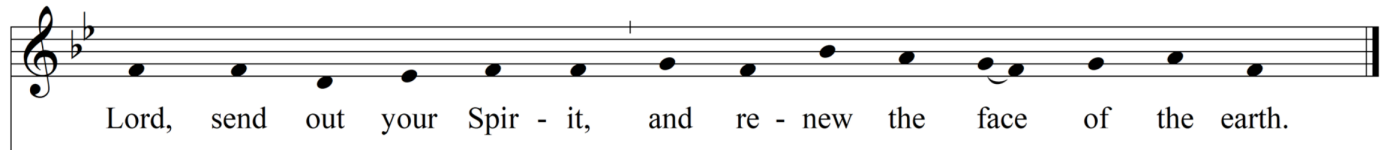


1. All you peoples, clap your hands,

and you renew the face of the earth. *R/*

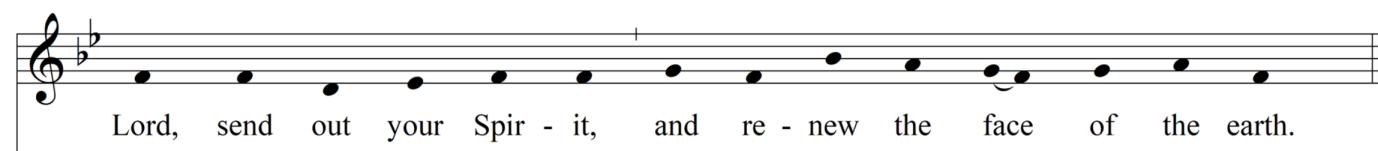

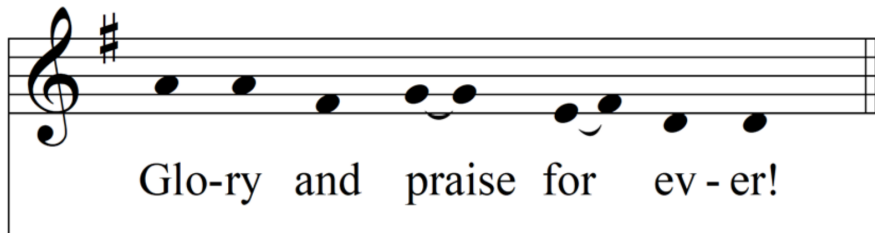

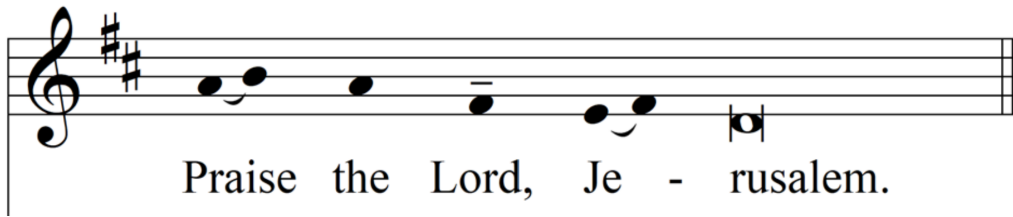


1. Blessed are you, O Lord, the God of our fathers,
