

Easter Day • Easter Common 1




3rd Sunday of Easter, Year A




- Exult, you just, in <u>the LORD</u>;

6th Sunday of Easter, Year A • 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C




- Shout joyfully to God, all <u>the</u> earth, sing praise to the glory <u>of</u> his name; proclaim his <u>glo</u>rious praise.


Ascension Vigil and Day • Common Ascension

Easter Vigil 1 • Pentecost Vigil 4 (and Pentecost Simple Vigil) • Common Pentecost






- Bless the LORD, O my soul!

 <u>are</u> created, and you renew the face of <u>the</u> earth. *R*/








Canticle Tone
