

Psalm Tone




- 1. Bless the LORD, O my soul!






- O LORD, my allotted portion <u>and</u> my cup, you it is who hold <u>fast</u> my lot.



Note:

Since 1970, the U.S. Lectionary has contained an important error at the end of the Exodus reading preceding this canticle.

According to the Latin original, the reading should end with "Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the LORD:" (last line but two), and the Canticle then follows **immediately**, with **no other** lines of scripture and **no** concluding formula ("The word of the Lord") intervening.




- God indeed is my savior;




Psalm Tone



- 1. The law of the LORD <u>is</u> perfect, refresh<u>ing</u> the soul; the decree of the <u>LORD</u> is trustworthy, giving wisdom <u>to</u> the simple. *R*/
- 2. The precepts of the LORD <u>are</u> right, rejoic<u>ing</u> the heart; the command of the <u>LORD</u> is clear, enlighten<u>ing</u> the eye. *R*/
- 3. The fear of the LORD <u>is</u> pure, endur<u>ing</u> forever; the ordinances of the <u>LORD</u> are true, all <u>of</u> them just. *R*/
- 4. They are more precious <u>than</u> gold, than a heap of <u>purest</u> gold; sweeter also than syrup or honey <u>from</u> the comb. *R*/

- 1. Athirst <u>is</u> my soul for God, the <u>liv</u>ing God.

 When <u>shall</u> I go and behold the <u>face</u> of God? *R*/
- 2. I went with the throng and led them in procession to the house of God, amid loud cries of joy and thanksgiving, with the multitude keeping festival. *R*/
- 3. Send forth your light and <u>your</u> fidelity; they shall <u>lead</u> me on and bring me to your <u>ho</u>ly mountain, to your <u>dwelling-place</u>. *R*/
