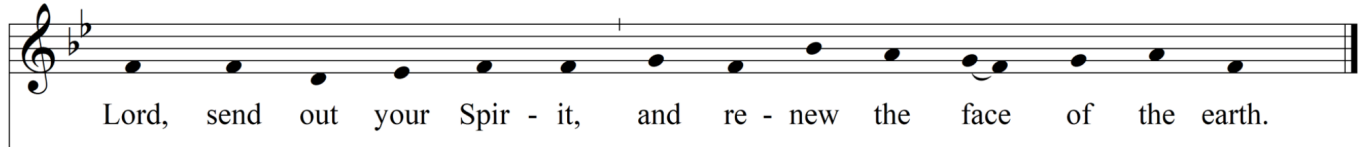

Psalm Tone

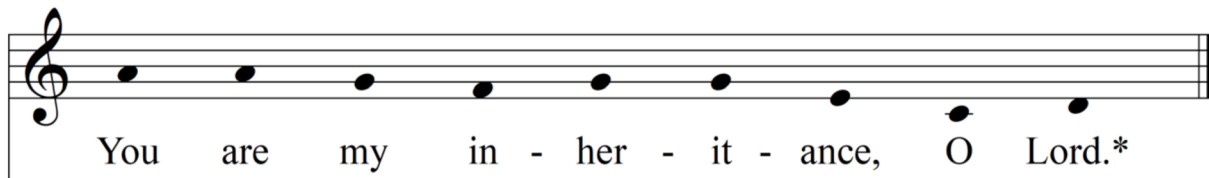


1. Bless the LORD, O my soul!

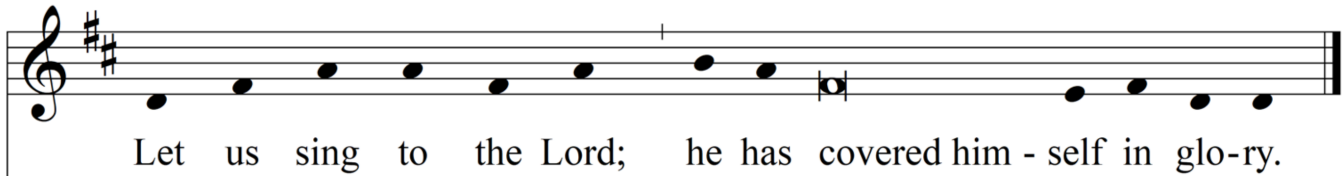


1. O LORD, my allotted portion and my cup,

Canticum Tone



1. I will sing to the LORD, for he is gloriously triumphant;
horse and chariot he has cast into the sea.
My strength and my courage is the LORD,
and he has been my savior.
He is my God, I praise him;
the God of my father, I extol him. *R/*
2. The LORD is a warrior,
LORD is his name!
[omit C, D]
Pharaoh's chariots and army he hurled into the sea;
the elite of his officers were submerged in the Red Sea. *R/*
3. The flood waters covered them,
they sank into the depths like a stone.
[omit C, D]
Your right hand, O LORD, magnificent in power,
your right hand, O LORD, has shattered the enemy. *R/*
4. You brought in the people you redeemed
and planted them on the mountain of
your inheritance
the place where you made your seat, O LORD,
the sanctuary, LORD, which your
hands established.
[omit E]
The LORD shall reign forever and ever. *R/*

Note:

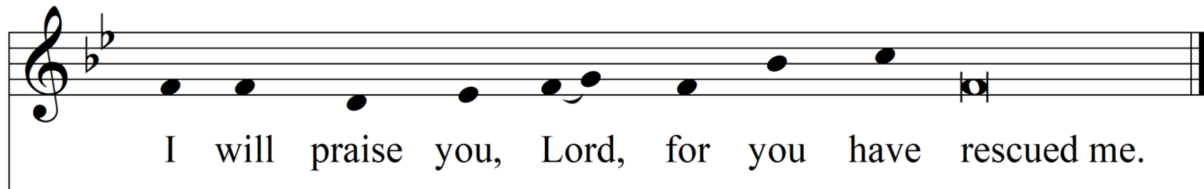
Since 1970, the U.S. Lectionary has contained an important error at the end of the Exodus reading preceding this canticum.

According to the Latin original, the reading should end with "Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the LORD:" (last line but two), and the Canticum then follows immediately, with no other lines of scripture and no concluding formula ("The word of the Lord") intervening.

Psalm Tone

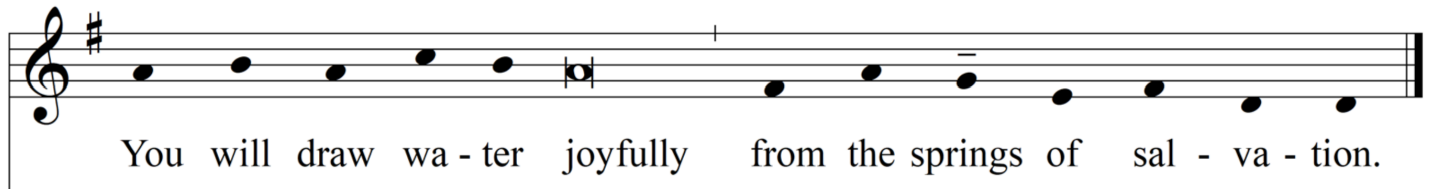


1. I will extol you, O LORD, for you drew me clear

3. Sing praise to the LORD

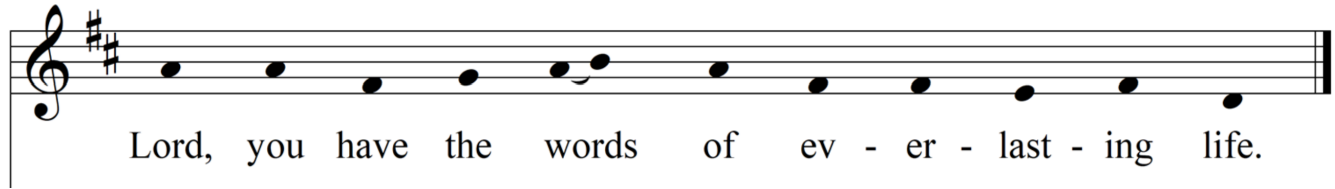
for his glorious achievement;

Psalm Tone

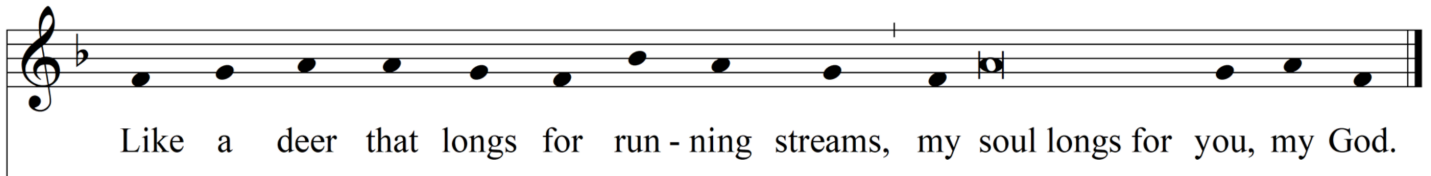


1. The law of the LORD is perfect,
