


 I did not restrain my lips, as you, <u>O</u> LORD, know. R/



- 5. I believe that I shall see the bounty of the LORD in the land of the living.Wait for the LORD, with courage; be stouthearted, and wait for the LORD. R/


4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

- 3. The fatherless and the widow the LORD <u>sus</u>tains, but the way of the wic<u>ked</u> he thwarts.


 The LORD shall <u>reign</u> forever; your God, O Zion, through all generations. <u>Al</u>leluia. *R*/
